

JAY H. NEFF HALL is a gift to the University of Missouri School of Journalism by one of its graduates, Mr. Ward A. Neff. The behilding is a memorial to his father and bears his name.

The senior Mr. Neff, who died August 14, 1915, won a high place in Missouri journalism therough his conduct of the Daily Drovers Telegram of Kansa City. With this stock yards daily as a nucleas the Neff family has developed a syndicated similar dailies in the principal live stock cities, including Omaha, East 8t. Louis and Chicago.

Mr. Ward A. Neff was graduated from the School of Journalism in 1913, having completed the fouryear course. He now lives in Chicago, and directs his publishing enterprises from a central office of the "Corn Belt Farm Dailies."

Jay H. Neff Hall is the first building to be given to the University of Missouri by one of its alumni.

Ground for the building was beoken by President A. Ross Hill in May, 1919, Journalism Week. Construction work is under way now, and the building is to be ready for occupancy early in 1920.






(From the architect's drawing South, Front, Elevation)










SECOND PLONIC PLAN
